

PAI : FAMILY INFORMATION

From the 1st day of the new school year, students who suffer from a chronic medical condition (asthma, allergy, epilepsy, diabetes) which requires special treatment or care must report to the Lycée infirmary (infirmerie@lyceefrançais.org.uk)

Depending on the case and following the request of the parents, Pastoral Care will draw up a list of these students to organise an appointment with the school doctor, Dr Momeni, who will decide whether or not to set up a *Projet d'Accueil Individualisé* (PAI).

This also concerns students for whom a PAI is already in place in the school who must renew it each year and would not have done so in June.

While waiting for an appointment with the school doctor, you must provide the following on the first day of school:

- A small emergency kit with the name of the child and a photo, ensuring the expiry dates of the drugs
- A medical certificate with a validity of less than two years: dated, signed by the practitioner with description, name of the disease/allergy, and symptoms
- The updated medical prescription: with the name of the drugs, dosage, and method of administration.
- Allergy test less than 2 years old, for all food allergies: nuts, eggs, soy, gluten, lactose, etc. (This test is not necessary if it is a PAI Asthma)
- Parental authorisation for the administration of the products, dated and signed (on request from Pastoral Care)
